



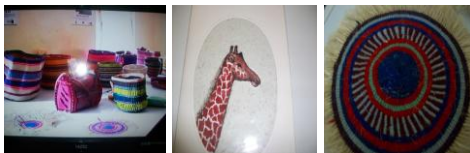
## Community involvement

**Green4Health:** The Kigano family has set aside an acre of land to assist struggling families impacted by AIDS plant vegetables to help in maintaining a healthy diet. We are reaching out to well-wishers and grantees to assist in installing a bore hole to keep the water running throughout the year. Nanyuki is a semi-arid area and experiences extremely long dry seasons.



**Food Bank:** We have reached out to the entire community in Nanyuki to get involved in donating food towards the food bank. This will assist the poorest maintain a balanced diet

**Women Group:** Over hundred women benefit from the social and talent networking program

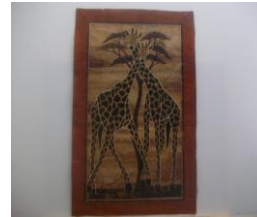
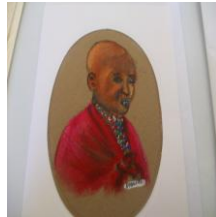


**Likii Special School:** Joined other organizations in supporting children with severe special needs in Likii village.
